Uluru, also known as Ayers Rock, is the largest rock in the world. It rises 345 meters above the plain in Central Australia. The circumference of the base is about 9 km. The piece was inspired by Gary Snyder's poem of the same name.

This piece utilizes only four pitches. A preferred tuning would be the following just intonation (other tunings, including equal temperament, are also usable).
